Personal attacks are tracked in a separate ledger and are NOT added to the misinformation denominator. Antisemitism analysis is intentionally omitted at the user's direction.

Executive assessment

Bottom line. The debate contains genuine empirical substance on both sides, but the evidentiary quality is highly asymmetric. Rachel Wilson's case relies heavily on striking numerical claims, broad causal narratives, counterfactual arithmetic and universal statements that frequently outrun the underlying sources. NotSoErudite's case is materially stronger on Claudia Goldin, marriage bars, multicausal modernization and the need for work-family policy, but she also makes several clear factual errors and overstates causal claims about Triffin, Gulf women's employment, U.S. historical power, corporate fiduciary duty and some demographic anecdotes.

Official V1 result. This audit identifies 66 consolidated material factual defects: 15 false, 31 unsupported, and 20 misleading or materially overstated. Of these, 52 are routed to Rachel Wilson and 14 to NotSoErudite. These are not percentages of everything either speaker said. Repetitions are consolidated, and moral judgments, predictions without a present factual premise, jokes and personal attacks are not automatically counted as misinformation.

Most important methodological caution. The supplied YouTube transcript is a print-to-PDF capture with no reliable speaker labels and visible automatic-transcription errors. This report therefore treats the page images as controlling. OCR is used only as an indexing aid. When speaker attribution is uncertain in crosstalk, the report marks it unresolved rather than guessing.

CONTROLLING SOURCE: supplied 97-page YouTube print PDF; transcript content is concentrated on print pages 1-41.

COMPARISON TEMPLATE: structure follows the supplied Pangburn Analysis Dave Farina Official V2 report, with its speaker firewall, verdict rules, denominator discipline, supported-core section, propaganda index, defect ledger and complete registry.

OMITTED BY REQUEST: antisemitism analysis.

ADDED BY REQUEST: dedicated personal-attack ledger with target, category, exact excerpt and speaker-route confidence.

ADVERSARIAL CONTROL: claims with genuine factual cores are not upgraded to false merely because the speaker's conclusion is aggressive; where evidence is incomplete, the verdict is unsupported or misleading rather than false.

Method, scope and evidentiary rules

1. Controlling source The controlling transcript source is the user-supplied PDF capture of the YouTube page for “Rachel Wilson vs. NotSoErudite | Is Feminism Doing More Good Or Harm?” The transcript is visible on print pages 1-41. The page images, not OCR text, control whenever wording or timestamp is disputed.

2. Quote-fidelity rule Quotation marks in the main ledger indicate words visible in the displayed transcript. Obvious typographical line breaks are normalized. YouTube-style profanity blanks are retained as [] where visible. Automatic-transcript misspellings are not silently used as factual evidence about names or concepts.

3. Speaker-routing firewall Routes used here are R = Rachel Wilson; N = NotSoErudite/Kyla; M = moderator/host; A = audience/Q&A; X = overlap or unresolved. Only high-confidence R and N propositions enter the misinformation ledger. Moderator and audience material is routed separately, and uncertain crosstalk is never guessed into a speaker's count.

4. Atomic claim decomposition Compound passages are split when distinct propositions require different evidence. Repetitions of the same proposition are consolidated. A statement with a true number and a defective inference may be rated misleading rather than false if the factual core is material.

5. Evidence hierarchy Primary official statistics, statutes/regulations, court materials, original scholarship and first-party institutional histories are preferred. Secondary sources are used mainly for context or to locate primary material. Unsupported means the public evidence does not justify the stated confidence; it does not mean the opposite proposition is proven.

6. Denominator discipline The headline number is a count of consolidated material defects, not a percentage of every sentence, minute, or claim in the debate. Unitization can change denominators; therefore this report does not manufacture a “misinformation percentage.” Personal attacks are also excluded from the misinformation denominator.

7. Verdicts FALSE = contradicted by strong evidence or a controlling source. UNSUPPORTED = asserted more strongly than available evidence permits or dependent on an unprovided/unauditable source. MISLEADING / OVERSTATED = contains a real core but materially distorts scope, certainty, context, causation or denominator. SUPPORTED CORE = materially supported proposition preserved outside the defect count. NOT RATEABLE = moral judgment, rhetoric, ambiguous wording, prediction without a rateable present premise, or unsafe speaker attribution.

8. Confidence High confidence means the verdict is anchored in a strong primary source or clear internal contradiction. Moderate confidence means the direction is well supported but source definitions, historical categorization or transcript ambiguity prevent maximal certainty.

Substantial supported core that V1 preserves

- **Rachel Wilson:** U.S. nonmarital childbearing has risen dramatically over the long run. In 2024, 39.5% of U.S. births were to unmarried women. [S01][S02]
- **Rachel Wilson:** Children living with two married biological parents had the lowest maltreatment rates in NIS-4; family structure is empirically associated with child-risk differences. The error is applying the >8x figure to every other family form. [S04]
- **Rachel Wilson:** The May 2026 labor-force-participation rate for men age 20+ was 69.5%. The error is broadening that statistic into “one in three men” generally and assigning a single motive. [S05]
- **Rachel Wilson:** Women owned about 39% of all U.S. employer and nonemployer businesses in 2023, while their share of total receipts was much smaller. The error is using receipts as proof of sex-specific GDP/productivity or “subsidy.” [S06]
- **Rachel Wilson:** South Korea's total fertility rate is extraordinarily low (about 0.7 in 2024); Pakistan's is much higher (about 3.5). Low fertility and population ageing are genuine policy problems. [S10][S11]
- **Rachel Wilson:** Pakistan has exceptionally high consanguineous-marriage prevalence, with real genetic/reproductive-health implications. The error is converting that into a monocausal explanation of Pakistan's economy. [S28]
- **Rachel Wilson:** The Ford Foundation did fund and help develop women's studies. The error is saying it literally created departments as a proven Marxist labor-engineering project. [S15][S16]
- **NotSoErudite:** Claudia Goldin's “quiet revolution” framework genuinely emphasizes women's changing career horizons, identity, expectations and decision-making, with a major transition around cohorts entering adulthood in the late 1960s/1970s. [S13]
- **NotSoErudite:** Marriage bars were real and widespread in teaching and clerical work through the first half of the twentieth century. [S14]
- **NotSoErudite:** Modern fertility decline is associated with modernization, delayed family formation, education, work-family conflict and economic conditions; it is not well captured by a one-variable “feminism causes fertility collapse” law. [S10][S11]
- **NotSoErudite:** Women's labor-force participation can expand effective labor supply and output; OECD explicitly treats persistent female employment gaps as a drag on economies facing ageing and labor shortages. [S11]
- **NotSoErudite:** FGM/C is documented among some Saudi women. The error is presenting a limited Jeddah convenience sample as a broad national descriptor without prevalence qualification. [S29]

Propaganda / rhetorical-intensity assessment

Definition and limitation. This is a transparent editorial heuristic, not a psychometric instrument and not a diagnosis of motive. In a live debate, “propaganda intensity” is better understood as the density of one-sided framing, certainty inflation, demonization, caricature, selective omission and audience-oriented affect. A speaker can score high while making some true claims; a low score would not guarantee factual accuracy.

Rachel Wilson total: 24/32 - HIGH RHETORICAL / PROPAGANDA INTENSITY. The dominant drivers are certainty inflation, source-free quantitative claims and a unified hidden-control/causal narrative around feminism, foundations, corporations and the state.

NotSoErudite total: 14/32 - MODERATE RHETORICAL / PROPAGANDA INTENSITY. Her factual architecture is less conspiratorial and more multicausal, but personal ridicule and some overconfident historical/economic claims materially raise the score.

Personal-attack ledger

Scope rule. A personal attack is recorded when a speaker targets the opponent's intelligence, competence, age, appearance, medication/drug use, family, status, character, likeability or personal demeanor rather than only criticizing an argument. Argument-level criticism ("that is a straw man," "your theory fails") is not counted unless it becomes person-directed. Crosstalk attacks with uncertain routing are preserved as unresolved rather than assigned.

Total recorded personal-attack units: 30. Rachel Wilson: 12; NotSoErudite: 15; unresolved crosstalk: 2; moderator: 1. These are counts of distinct attack units, not a severity-weighted score.

Census data do show major long-run family-structure change, but the exact pair of figures is not securely sourced here.

No winner-by-count inference. The counts describe this transcript and this unitization. They are not a general ranking of the speakers' truthfulness, intelligence or character, and they should not be converted into a percentage without a defensible denominator.

Appendix B. Moderator, audience and unresolved-routing controls

Moderator and audience claims are not silently counted against either debater. The Q&A contains factual assertions (for example, family-court statistics and claims about Margaret Sanger) that would require separate speaker-specific checking if the project scope expands beyond the two named debaters. The present report records them in the complete registry but excludes them from Rachel/Kyla misinformation counts.

Unresolved crosstalk. At 1:48:22-1:48:44 the transcript contains “Do you want to know anything that you’re talking about?” and “likability/insufferable” lines during rapid exchange. Because the print transcript has no speaker labels and turn boundaries are ambiguous, those attacks are preserved as unresolved instead of being assigned by guesswork.

Audience family heckle. Around 58 minutes, NotSoErudite responds, “I’ve miscarried twice, but nice try. Relax,” and the moderator tells the audience not to bring up people’s families. The provoking audience words are not fully recoverable in the displayed transcript, so this report does not fabricate an exact heckle quote.
